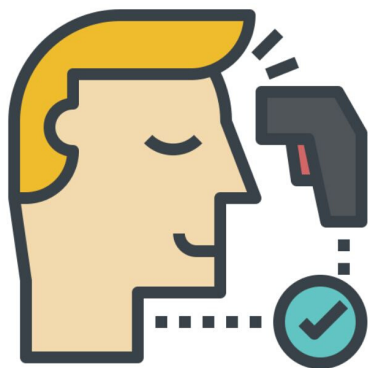


IMPORTANT NOTICE ON UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

We understand the problems and frustration this may have caused which is why we are working diligently on other options for you to receive your unemployment benefits.



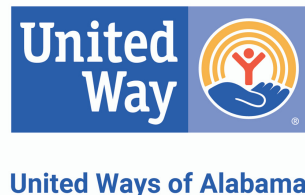
Temperature Checks

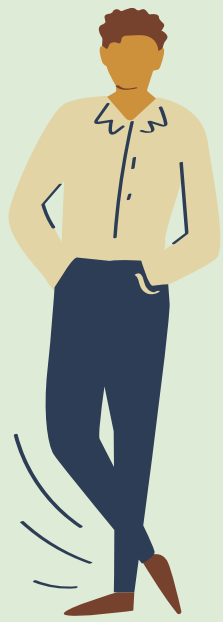
